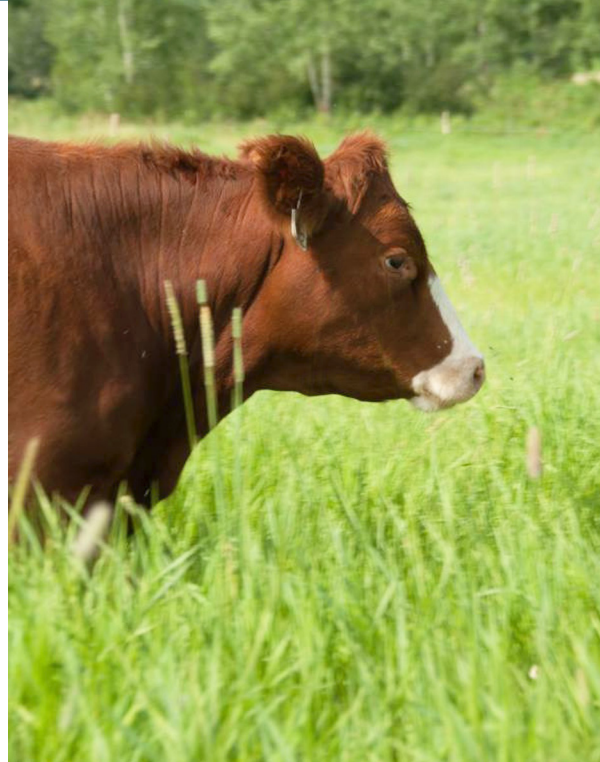


PURPOSE

- official community plans within or impacting the ALR or for agriculture uses



MEMBERSHIP



The committee consists of five to thirteen members nominated and selected by the agricultural community of the Cariboo and approved by the Cariboo Regional District.

Membership includes:

- one member representing cattle ranching
- one member representing forage
- one member representing horticulture and vegetable producers
- one member representing farmer's markets
- two-eight members representing agricultural economics, agroforestry, farmer's institutes, post-secondary institutes, First Nations or any other major agricultural sector producing in the North Cariboo
- one member representing the Agrologist profession
