I support CRD pursuing improved internet service through: (check all that apply):
☐ Internet service provider (like Telus) builds the infrastructure to provide service and owns it. CRD provides non-monetary support only. All control and future responsibilities are the responsibility of the provider. (Keep in mind that this may mean some areas don't get service.)
☐ CRD provides support to the service provider and subsidizes the cost (through federal grants, ie. gas tax or other). The service provider still owns the infrastructure, and all control and future responsibilities are the responsibility of the provider.
☐ CRD provides service by building, owning and maintaining an internet utility. Costs would be covered through a combination of sources like federal and provincial grants, CRD contributions, ie. gas tax or other). A new ongoing taxpayer funded CRD service would be established and control and future responsibilities are the responsibility of CRD.
