Re: West Coast Amusements Use of Outriders Grounds

Yesterday (April 20) I noted the appearance of West Coast Amusements rides in the South Cariboo Arena parking lot; I did not pay much attention at that time. An hour later I received a telephone call from an Outrider member attempting to conduct a regular Pony Club instruction session complaining that our grounds were almost entirely filled with trucks, trailers, and campers, and that it was difficult to maneuver a horse trailer in our normal parking area. There was also quite a lot of back and forth traffic through the limit space left open.

At this same time the girl's soccer team from the Junior High School had come to use our parking area for their practice (having asked permission 10 days in advance), and were told by West Coast personnel that it was "off limits" (the area used for soccer was entirely covered with parked RVs).

I do not necessarily object to West Coast using our grounds for parking, although they create a lot of heavy vehicle traffic on the grassy areas that we also use for temporary performance rings or warm-up. The gate at the back of the ice-rink was damaged and removed when West Coast left last year, and has still not been replaced. I strongly object to receiving no notification or request for use of our grounds with sufficient notice to plan any events our Club might be running.

If any other organization wishes to use the Outriders grounds they make an application to the Club; we have a standard rental contract with daily rates, cleanup deposit, proof of insurance, and rules of use. We look at the nature of the requesting organization and often reduce or forego the rental rate (or accept work in lieu thereof). We have, for instance, the B.C. Backcountry Horseman's Assoc. annual general meeting next year – they made written application to use our grounds, and will be bringing approximately 200-250 people to 100 Mile House for a weekend – and there would be some very upset people should West Coast, or any other organization, show up unannounced on those dates.

The Outriders Club has never unreasonably refused a request for use of our grounds. We are well supported by this community, and we try to be supportive in return. We do expect some respect for our tenure and our ongoing use of this property, and would appreciate better communication if others wish to use our facilities.
