4. Action Plan to Achieve 2014 Goals
 - (a) Heritage Registry
 - (i) Roddis House. Completed
 - (ii) The Petroglyph. See item 4(c)(ii) below
 - (iii) Barkerville/Cottonwood House. Ready to be added to the registries
 - (iv) Little Lake House. Almost completed
 - (v) 150 Mile House Barns. Completed
 - (vi) Alexis Creek. Work has started on the preparation of an SoS.

 - (viii) The Matrix is now up to date, and will henceforth be distributed at each meeting and then attached to the meeting notes.
 - (b) Heritage Awareness

The City of Williams Lake is working on various plans.

Moved George/Brent that the Steering Committee be authorized (a) to work in partnership with the City with a view to presenting a Heritage Circle event during Stampede Week, and (b) to contribute up to \$500 to the cost. Carried

The CRD motion to move Heritage Week to a time later in the calendar year was unanimously endorsed at the UBCM's 2013 annual convention, and discussions are ongoing between the UBCM and the Province.

Penny Hutchinson provided an account of activities taking place in the Chilcotin which include the possibility of establishing a language and culture society.

(c) First Nations Sites

(i) First Nations Registries –Phyllis will continue monitoring the progress of the Joint Working Group that has been established to assist individual First Nations wishing to establish their own registries.

(ii) The Petroglyph. The date for opening wheelchair access to the site has been changed to September 20, 2014.

(d) Telegraph Trail – The SoS has been completed. It will be submitted to the CRD Board's March 2014 meeting, and if adopted, will be placed on the CRD Register. That will be followed by the necessary advertising.

(e) Heritage Driving Tour Brochure – 2,000 copies will be printed as soon as possible, and it was agreed that we should track where they get distributed, paying particular attention to those towns that act as gateways to the South and Central Cariboo.

(f) North Cariboo and Carrier Committee Representatives – A replacement for Trina is still under consideration..
